FOR THE LOVE OF PETS PANTRY EDUCATION: AFTER SCHOOL TRAINING CLINTON MIDDLE SCHOOL



Shadow was rescued from a life of living on a chain without adequate food or shelter. Even through this, we knew Shadow was special and could make a difference for someone. So AC ARF contacted Train a Dog Save a Warrior (TADSAW). This is a wonderful organization that works to train service dogs with veterans with specific needs and, at no cost to the veteran.



Shadow was accepted into TADSAW's program and is now progressing in her training to become a Certified Service Dog for a very special veteran who suffers from PTSD. The veteran and his family are so grateful for Shadow, and Shadow is very happy to have a family who loves and takes care of her. Truly a win-win for all and a testament to how rescues networking help those in need.



For the Love of Pets Pantry is a needs-based pet pantry helping keep low income seniors and their pets together, and reducing the number of animals surrendered to shelters.

AC ARF partners with SARG, local rescues, businesses and vet clinics to collect and distribute over 1000 pounds of dog and cat food **every month** (not including canned food, treats and other supplies). The program currently supports over 60 low income seniors and 200 pets. We are thankful for all the volunteers and students who help keep the pantry going.

The Covid19 epidemic has affected our food supply and we are running low. On Mar 5 we held our first class "Caring for Homeless Cats" for an after school program at Clinton Middle School, and talked about the needs of community cats. We helped them build outdoor shelters for homeless cats; the shelters will be distributed to low income seniors feeding homeless cats.


OUTREACH AND EDUCATION

Health Care

Two of our Pet Pantry's low income seniors had pets needing surgery; in January, Gracie's ACL was repaired and in February Abby's mammary tumors were removed. Both dogs are doing well and back at home with their loving families!





Spay/Neuter/Vaccination

Spay/Neuter/Vaccinate - AC ARF is determined to do all it can to ensure that all pets are altered and vaccinated. In partnership with SARG, the 2020 **TNR Low Income Clinton Senior Citizen Initiative** will focus on trapping community cats being cared for by our low income senior citizens so they can be spayed/neutered/vaccinated and released back to their homes. We have identified over 40 cats that will be part of this initial program. Many thanks to AgriFeed **Pet Supplies** for helping sponsor this program with cat traps.
