FEATURE – FOR THE LOVE OF PETS PANTRY

AC ARF's **For The Love Of Pets Pantry** provides low income seniors with pet food, supplies and preventatives. The pantry is sustained solely by donations and all donations go directly to the seniors and their pets. Over 1000 pounds of dry food is distributed monthly, helping feed 95 dogs and 82 cats, and more seniors enter the program each month. Pictured here are some of our volunteers who help pack, move and distribute donations. We couldn't do it without community support!



For the Love of Pets Pantry is a needs-based pet pantry that helps keep low income seniors and their pets together, and reduces the number of animals surrendered to shelters. Our monthly goal is to provide 50% of the food needed for each pet. Donations are distributed 10:00 am-12:00 pm on the 2nd Monday of each month to seniors registered in the program. Anderson County seniors age 60 and older who meet income guidelines are eligible to apply. For more information, call 865-457-3259. PROGRAMS

OUTREACH AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS - Working with local organizations and schools, AC ARF provides educational programs and resources to educate our community to improve the lives of our pets. Informed pet owners means better lives for animals and helps keep pets out of the shelters.

PET SAFETY NET PROGRAMS - These programs help pet owners experiencing challenges caring for their pets, including rehoming and facilitating health care.

For The Love of Pets Pantry provides low income seniors with pet food, supplies and preventatives.

Retain/Rehome - Some pet owners need help to be able to keep their animals, and others need to find new homes for their pets. AC ARF helped rehome 25 pets, animals that now have a future. We also work with Go North and other transport collaboratives, and many lives are saved thanks to the dedication of these organizations and the service they provide.

AC ARF fostered Sweets and Sammie for 6 months to find just the right home. When Hulk's mama could no longer care for him because of health issues, we helped find him another home. These pets are now in loving homes and their former owners are much relieved they will be well looked after.





Health Care - AC ARF helps facilitate veterinary care for pet owners with support from community sponsors and partnerships. Buster and Padillia were able to have vital surgery, and we helped get Willow, a young cat with reduced vision, into a rescue that could provide the critical care she needed.

Spay/Neuter/Vaccination — AC ARF is determined to do all it can to ensure that all pets are altered and vaccinated. Partnering with animal caretakers, the Univ. of TN CAIT mobile Spay/Neuter clinic, and the Clinton Animal Hospital, AC ARF has facilitated spaying, neutering and vaccinating of 14 community cats. ❖
