

For the Love of Pets Pantry

This is AC ARF's signature program that serves low income Anderson County senior citizens with pets. In partnership with SARG, we support over 300 dogs and cats belonging to low income senior citizens in Anderson County each month. Through this program, we have distributed 6,370 lbs. of pet food from May-Aug 2022, excluding canned foods and treats also distributed each month. For 2022, we have distributed over 12,000 lbs of pet food at an average of over 1500 lbs per month. Our pet pantry program has become a staple of our community as

we continue to add new families in need each month. These pets are family to their owners and, for so many, the only family they have. Please see how you can help by donating pet food to our pet pantry in the "Ways You Can Help" section of our newsletter.

Adopt/Rehome/Rescue/Vet Care

From May-Aug 2022, we have sponsored required medical treatment for 43 dogs and cats in our community! These pets belong to low income citizens in Anderson County who needed a little help in making sure their pets received the care they needed! We also found new homes for 15 dogs and cats, excluding kittens/cats from TNR program, so that they did not have to be surrendered to the shelter.

To date, we have spayed/neutered/vaccinated a total of 294 cats/kittens through our TNR Initiative with SARG. And, as part of this program, we rescued and rehomed 133 kittens/cats! From May-Aug 2022 only, we have spayed/neutered/vaccinated 106 cats/kittens and rehomed 31! It's been a very busy summer! We appreciate our partnerships with SARG and HSTV to be able to continue our progress to help community cats in our area. PLEASE SPAY AND NEUTER YOUR PETS! IT'S SO IMPORTANT!

COMMUNITY NEEDS - MEDICAL TREATMENTS

Several of our low income citizens needed a little help to make sure their pets stayed healthy and at home!



Charlie is a very special boy who was rescued by some very special people. Twice! Once roaming the woods in search of food and shelter and heartworm positive, he is now in a

perfect home where he is safe and loved unconditionally! He has completed all rounds of his heartworm treatment and is on the road to a full recovery! He even has a cat sister and his own pontoon boat to play on! How cool is that! We love you, Charlie!

Boo Boo belongs to one of our low income senior families and had a large abscess on her face with a severe infection.



Clinton Animal Hospital lanced, cleaned and sutured the abscess and, after a round of antibiotics, she is healthy and happy again inside with her family!



Storm was found wandering the streets of Oliver Springs during a major storm and was picked up by a couple of good Samaritans on their way home. He had multiple wounds which were filled with maggots. Thanks to the wonderful vet care from the staff at Clinton Animal Hospital, Storm is now happily living the good life of a hound dog with his newly adopted family in Oliver Springs! Way to go Storm!

Roxy belongs to a low income citizen of Anderson County and she, along with her two sisters, were having terrible reactions to fleas. Roxy's skin allergy was so bad that she had lost most of her fur and her skin was red and inflamed. All dogs were given oral flea meds as well as antibiotics and steroids for Roxy and one of her sisters. After a full round of steroids and antibiotics, and a monthly regimen of flea meds, Roxy's fur has fully grown back and she and her sisters are back to their happy, bouncy selves!



We also provided Vet Care for 24 additional dogs (Rocky, Princess, Bo, Whiskey, Scotch, Cowboy, Margo, King, Daisy, Oakley, Rexie, Maddie, Luna, Adrian, Taco, Mocha, Sugar, Bando, Topaz and her 5 puppies) and 8 additional cats (Ellie, Kitty, Prince, Little Girl, Princess, Pearl, Julie and Momma K)
